MEASURING THE PASTOR'S IMPACT ON THE GROWTH, PLATEAU OR DECLINE OF THE CHURCH HE SERVES

Based upon research conducted by Kelton F. Hinton in the JBA 2014-2015

Study Participants

- ✓ 28 participants, a "qualitative" study
- Minimum of 5 years tenure
- Located in (or near) the JBA, a rural association in eastern NC

Parameters for Grouping:

- Growing church had to grow FASTER than the 3.5% annual population growth rate over the tenure of the pastor
- Plateaued church grew UP TO 3.5% annually in Worship Attendance
- Declining church HELD STEADY or DECLINED numerically in Worship Attendance over the tenure of the pastor

- 10 Growing churches
- 8 Plateaued churches
- 10 Declining churches

Size of churches

- eleven (< 100) 39%
- Nine (100-200) 32%
- Three (200-300) 11%
- Two (300-400) 7%
- Two (400-500) 7%
- One (500+)-4%

Located in:

- 60% in open country or suburbia
- 40% in small towns or medium-sized cities

SEVEN (CHANGEABLE) BEHAVIORS AND ATTITUDES OF GROWING PASTORS

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The Seven Areas...

- Acceptingresponsibility for thehealth of the church
- 2) Daily Quiet Time
- 3) Finding mentors & coaches
- 4) Informal (and deep) peer support

- 5) Connecting w/God in worship planning & execution
- 6) Home visits
- 7) Leadership development

Accepting responsibility for the health of the church

GROWING & PLATEAUED

- Vision Issue (# 1-2 out of 11)
- Inadequate Pastoral Leadership (# 3 for growing, #5 for plateaued)
- Calling a new Pastor (# 3 for plateaued, #7 for growing)

DECLINING

- Vision Issue (# 4-5 out of 11)
- Inadequate Pastoral Leadership (# 5-6)
- Calling a new Pastor (# 10)

Daily Quiet Time

GROWING & PLATEAUED

- 60 & 62% read their
 Bible DAILY for
 personal instruction
 (not related to church
 work)
- (bi-vo pastors struggled the most in this area)

DECLINING

Only 30% read their
 Bible DAILY for
 personal instruction
 (not related to church
 work)

Finding (and Keeping) a Mentor or Coach

PASTORS OF GROWING CHURCHES

- > 60% in first 5 yrs
- > 89% in the past

Now...

> 67% currently maintain such relationships

PASTORS OF PLATEAUED & DECLINING CHURCHES

> 100% initially

Now...

- 40% of declining
- > 33% of plateaued

Informal (and deep) Peer Support

PASTORS OF GROWING CHURCHES

- 50% involved in informal peer support groups meeting monthly
- Higher levels of deep interactions and accountability

PASTORS OF PLATEAUED & DECLINING CHURCHES

- > 40% of declining involved in informal peer support meeting bi-monthly
- > (only 10% of plateaued pastors)
- Surface-level conversations and low accountability

Connecting with God in Worship Planning & Execution

PASTORS OF GROWING CHURCHES

* 40% "always" (30% "frequently") felt the presence and power of God in planning and leading worship in the last six months

PASTORS OF PLATEAUED & DECLINING CHURCHES

* 38% of plateaued and only 20% of declining "always" felt God's presence in planning or leading worship (40% "frequently" and 30% "often")

Home Visits: one of the keys to growth

PASTORS OF GROWING CHURCHES

44% favored "home visits" over all other forms of pastoral care

PASTORS OF PLATEAUED & DECLINING CHURCHES

- 50% of pastors serving plateaued churches favored "hospital visits"
- 40% of pastors serving in declining situations favored "hospital" or "bereavement" situations for primary pastoral care

Leadership Development: Planning for Future Growth

PASTORS OF GROWING CHURCHES

80% have a strategy in place (50% formalized, 50% informal)

PASTORS OF PLATEAUED & DECLINING CHURCHES

- 50% of pastors serving in plateaued situations have strategy (25% formalized, 75% informal)
- 60% of pastors serving declining churches have a strategy (17% formalized, 83% informal)

Birth Order

Growing Pastors – 50% <u>Firstborn</u> (20% Middle, 30% Youngest, NO only)

Plateaued Pastors — 38% Middle children (25% Firstborn, 25% Youngest, 13% Only)

Declining Pastors – 40% Youngest (30% Firstborn, 10% Middle, 20% Only)

Age of the Pastors (34—78 years old)

(see Num 4:1-3 & 8:24-26; Lk 3:1-2, 23)

GROWING & DECLINING

Average age – 51

60% Growing began w/in 30-50 range (30% below, 10% above)

50% Declining began w/in 30-50 range (40% below, 10% above)

PLATEAUED


Average age - 63

38% Plateaued began w/in 30-50 range

63% above that range

GROWING & PLATEAUED

Growing – age 16, Lordship at 19

67% Developmental conversion experience (67% Lordship) 33% Process conversion experience

Plateaued – age 17, Lordship at 22

63% Developmental conversion experience (60% Lordship) 25% Crisis, 13% Process

DECLINING

Declining – age 13, Lordship at 17

80% Developmental conversion experience (only 38% Lordship) 10% Crisis, 10% Process

19 Pastors (6 growing, 5 plateaued, 8 declining)

Avg age – 10

9 followed with a Lordship response

Avg age – 18

Baptized the most children (28.4%)

CRISIS

3 Pastors (2 plateaued, 1 declining)

Avg age – 32

Baptized the most adults (59.7%)

PROCESS

5 Pastors (3 growing, 1 plateaued, 1 declining)

Avg age – 22

Baptized the most youth (26.6%)

Call to Ministry

GROWING

Pastor's age at call – 27

70% responded to a "specific" call (pastor, preach, evangelist, etc.)


PLATEAUED & DECLINING

Pastor's age at call – 23 for plateaued 50% responded to a "specific" call

Pastor's age at call – 22 for declining Only 40% responded to a "specific" call

Ages of Children (cont.)

Generally speaking, when the number of preschool aged children increased to three, numerical growth in the church ceased.

Once the youngest child began elementary school, numerical growth in the church began again.

Attitude Towards Life

Growing – 56% considered themselves "optimistic"

- Plateaued 75% "optimistic"
- Declining 45% "optimistic"
